The following itineraries provide some suggestions on how to plan and divide your time in Killarney. Take inspiration, mix and match the suggested activities and design your own bespoke holiday...

One Day ITINERARY

Killarney National Park Highlights – Self-drive

Begin your day with a view to awake your senses. Ladies View is a spectacular viewing point just 19kms from Killarney, take the N71 towards Kenmare before parking at the beauty spot.

From here travel back towards Killarney stopping first at Torc Waterfall. The waterfall is located 200m from the car park and is well signposted.

After Torc Waterfall, travel again along the N71 towards Killarney, this time stopping at Muckross House and Gardens. There are a number of short walks around the gardens and the visitor centre includes a casual restaurant, making it the ideal lunch stop.

Returning to the N71 towards Killarney, another interesting stop is the ruins of nearby Muckross Abbey, there is a small carpark alongside the main road and the abbey is just a short walk from here.

Travelling again towards Killarney, turn left at Ross Road, continue to the end of this road and you will arrive at Ross Castle. This 15th century castle overlooks beautiful Lough Leane, the castle is open to the public during the summer months and if you would like to stretch your legs then take a stroll around Ross Island.

Arriving back into Killarney town centre, it's time to park your car and pay a visit to Killarney House and St Mary's Cathedral. Killarney House is located just a few 100m from the town centre and can be accessed through "The Golden Gates" on Muckross Road (N71). Guided tours of the house are available during the summer months. St Mary's Cathedral is also just a few 100m from the town centre at the end of New Street and at the edge of Killarney National Park's Demesne. Both of these town centre gems are not to be missed. And that completes your whirlwind tour of Killarney National Park.
